

Barring Process

In order to have your spouse legally barred from the community or residence, one of the following documents must be provided.

Check box with the items that you are providing and submit paperwork to a Security Supervisor immediately; if a supervisor is not available ask for one to be contacted.

- Family Violence Ex Parte Protective Order: Form is issued upon the alleged complaint that the spouse has committed acts of Family Violence and that the complainant is in reasonable fear of his/her safety and children.**

This form can be provided by the Forsyth County Sheriff Department. This form must be signed by the Clerk of Superior Court and Forsyth County Superior Court Judge.

- Temporary Protective Order:**

This form can be provided by the Forsyth County Sheriff Department. This form must be signed by the Clerk of Superior Court and Forsyth County Superior Court Judge

- Stalking Twelve-Month Protective Order; Form is issued upon the Court finding that there is sufficient reason to believe that violence has occurred under the stalking statute and that there is a substantial likelihood of future violence.**

This form can be provided by the Forsyth County sheriff Department. This form must be signed by the Clerk of Superior Court and Forsyth County Superior Court Judge.

- Quitclaim Deed: Form that shows that the spouse has turned over complete ownership of real estate property within Laurel Spring HOA.**

This form must be signed by the Clerk of Superior Court and Forsyth County Superior Court Judge or any presiding judge of any county or state

- Proof of Single Ownership of Residence: Sales contract that identifies you as the sole owner of the property**
